Debuted in June 2018, Bvlgari Hotel Shanghai is the sixth global jewel of Bvlgari's hospitality collection. Located on the Suhe Creek waterfront, it forms part of the SUHE CREEK project, a riverside urban revitalization composed of residential, retail, art spaces and parks.

Balancing nature, contemporary design and heritage architecture, the property combines a 48-storey tower and the majestically restored the former Chamber of Commerce Shanghai building dating from 1916, surrounded by lush gardens. The sky tower offers stunning views of the iconic Bund, Pudong Financial District and the dramatic curvature of Huangpu River and Suhe Creek, with the hotel crowning the top eight floors, while the lower levels occupied by The Bvlgari Residences. ACPV ARCHITECTS Antonio Citterio Patricia Viel, the renowned Italian architectural firm that has designed each Bvlgari Hotel and Resort around the world, has created a glamorous contemporary masterpiece by blending the distinctive Italian refinement of Bvlgari with rich layers of Shanghai history.

In the spirit of integral design, ACPV ARCHITECTS Antonio Citterio Patricia Viel hand-selected or custom-designed each element of the hotel's interior to ensure its consistency, comfort and purity of Italian style. The understated aesthetic drama of matte black granite and light Navona travertine are complemented by polished teak and shining bronze detailing to create a warm residential ambience throughout Bvlgari Hotel Shanghai.

The hotel's 82 exquisitely crafted guestrooms, including 19 suites, are among the spacious in the city. Guests experience the exceptional comfort of modern Italian furnishings custom-made by revered Italian brands, including B&B, Maxalto, Flos and Flexform, along with state-of-the-art technology. Accessed via a private lift, the exceptional 400sqm Bvlgari Suite offers sweeping views of the Shanghai cityscape and can be extended to create a 570sqm three-bedroom residence by connecting with adjoining rooms.

Bvlgari Hotel Shanghai is home to six signature dining options located both in the hotel tower and in the adjacent historic former Chamber of Commerce Shanghai. Curated by Niko Romito, the celebrated chefs with three Michelin stars for his Reale restaurant in Abruzzo, one Michelin star awarded Il Ristorante – Niko Romito presents a carefully curated canon of contemporary Italian



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cooking in a seductive 47th floor restaurant overlooking the city lights. On the same floor, The Bvlgari Bar with its iconic oval bar, is the place to be for sophisticated drinks and socializing. Rooftop La Terrazza offers a casual sipping and supping menu with spellbinding views of Shanghai's skyline that brushes the clouds'. China's first Bvlgari Dolci boutique on the ground floor indulges guests with 'chocolate gems' created in the adjoining chocolate atelier for a luxury treat. The refined ambience of the Lounge opens up to Il Giardino, an enchanting outdoor space. Also located on the ground floor is an intimate Bvlgari store showcasing the brand's value collections.

The hotel's 2,000-square-metre The Bvlgari Spa and fitness center is a harmonious retreat to balance the body, mind and spirit in elegant Italian style. The Bvlgari Spa offers 8 SPA treatment rooms, sauna and relaxation rooms, a manicure and pedicure salon, barber and hairdresser, plus a 25-metre heated indoor pool and vitality pools, and Bvlgari gymnasium fitness center.

Adjacent to the hotel tower, the historic former Chamber of Commerce Shanghai built in 1916 and completely restored to evoke memories of its glorious past, houses a glamorous 500sqm Bvlgari Ballroom with double-height ceilings, haute-cuisine Cantonese restaurant Bao Li Xuan and The Whisky Bar.

A jewel of the historical former Chamber of Commerce Shanghai, Bao Li Xuan Restaurant blends the essential Italian glamour of Bvlgari with distinctive Chinese culture (opened on 16th October 2018). The name Bao Li Xuan means "nature's treasure and magnificence". Chinese Executive Chef Fu serves exquisite Cantonese classics specialties, with his culinary excellence, Bao Li Xuan was awarded one Michelin star in 2020 and two Michelin stars in 2021. The sophisticated Whisky Bar on the same floor presents an extensive collection of premium whiskies and spirits to be enjoyed in a warm and distinguished atmosphere akin to a member's club.

Constructed in Neoclassical Renaissance style, the statuesque heritage landmark forms a serendipitous connection to Bvlgari's Roman roots and is beautifully complemented by a grand Archway gate from the 1920s. The Archway resembles the triumphal arches of Rome while simultaneously reflects the influences of Chinese design, and now forms a magnificent VIP entrance to the property.



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Enjoying an exclusive setting amid private gardens, historic buildings and art galleries, the hotel is just three minutes' drive from the iconic Bund. The chic fashion boutiques of Nanjing Road, known as 'Shanghai's Fifth Avenue,' and the famous museums and theatres of People's Square are just 10 minutes away. Balancing nature, art and living, guests can conveniently visit signature Shanghai attractions, such as Yu Garden, Xintiandi and the contemporary galleries of M50. The hotel is just 45 minutes' drive from Pudong International Airport, and 35 minutes from Hongqiao International Airport.

DESTINATION

Cosmopolitan Shanghai's photogenic landscape presents dramatic juxtapositions at every turn. Known as the Pearl of the Orient since the 1930s, this is a place where heritage meets futurism, and timeless customs blend with global innovation. In traditional lanes, narrow houses crouch in the shadows of cavernous malls, and in the city's many parks and public spaces elderly taiji practitioners carve shapes in the air while young urbanites mingle with the international jet-set.

As Shanghai reaches for the future, it retains a nostalgic eye on yesteryear. From sleepy fishing village to pulsing global metropolis, Shanghai owes much of its impressive transformation to its waterways. A gateway for merchant ships plying the East China Sea, the broad Huangpu River slices the city in half, while Suzhou Creek meanders through downtown toward Bvlgari Hotel Shanghai. As a vital inland transport route, Suhe Creek helped power Shanghai's early 20th-Century economic boom, and the city's iconic skyline rose around it.

Reimagined by a two-decade-long urban rejuvenation, Suhe Creek has reclaimed its status as the eclectic heartbeat of Shanghai. Inspired by New York's "High Line" as a cultural thread linking the vibrant city fabric, the waterfront is lined with urban parks, walkways and luxury residences. Once derelict warehouses have been repurposed as vibrant art museums and river-view cafes. Proudly standing as the centerpiece of the glamorous new district, Bvlgari Hotel Shanghai's Italian air perfectly complements China's glittering nexus of contemporary elegance.

THE CONCEPT

Bulgari Hotel Shanghai was born as a glamorous jewel shining serenely over the Pearl of the Orient. Located on the banks of Suzhou Creek, it forms part of the SUHE CREEK project, a riverside urban revitalisation composed of residential, retail, art spaces and parks.

ACPV ARCHITECTS Antonio Citterio Patricia Viel, the renowned Italian architectural firm that has designed each Bulgari Hotel and Resort around the world, has crafted a true masterpiece combining a 48-storey contemporary tower and the majestically restored 20th Century former Chamber of Commerce Shanghai, surrounded by private Italian gardens. Blending the essential Italian glamour of Bulgari with distinctive Chinese cultural elements, Bulgari Hotel Shanghai presents a soulful ambience of escapism and tranquility perfect for the fast-paced metropolis.

In the spirit of integral design dating back to the 1930s, Italian architectural firm ACPV ARCHITECTS Antonio Citterio Patricia Viel hand-selected or custom-designed each element of the hotel's interior to ensure stylistic consistency, comfort and purity of Italian style. The understated aesthetic drama of matte black granite and light Navona travertine are complemented by polished teak and shining bronze detailing to create a warm residential ambience throughout Bulgari Hotel Shanghai.

CONTEMPORARY ITALIAN STYLE

Entering beneath the iconic Bulgari doorway sign, guests are immediately transported into a lifestyle of luxurious residential comforts and sophisticated Italian flair. The dark marble lobby is framed with double-height windows showcasing elegant garden scenery evocative of Bulgari Hotel Milano. Bespoke glass and bronze 'Pantheon-mesh' screens glow seductively with warm lighting. Embellishing the welcome experience are custom-crafted lamps inspired by the 1930s Shanghai Deco aesthetic hanging above leather embossed check-in desks.

A central fireplace is wrapped with an illuminated metal case featuring a classic Bulgari graphic, just one of a collection of iconic features found in all Bulgari Hotels & Resorts. Displayed in the lobby



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and public areas are glamorous black-and-white photographs dating from the Dolce Vita era, underscoring Bvlgari's inimitable red carpet heritage. Igniting the black granite lift hall, shining marble vitrines, sculpted to resemble those in the flagship Via dei Condotti boutique in Rome, showcase spectacular Bvlgari jeweled wonders within.

The corridors of the private guest floors impart a peerless sense of luxury. Lift doors open to reveal broad hallways decorated in louvered walnut wood accented with custom-made dark bronze and mesh screens. Adorning the walls are framed artworks depicting vintage Bvlgari advertisements from the 1960s and 1970s snapped by celebrity photographers. On every floor, the hallways are bookended by a large window creating a prism of natural light and framing spectacular panoramas of the Shanghai skyline.

Guestrooms effortlessly fuse classic and contemporary Chinese and Italian design. Guests will immediately feel soothed by the becalming elegant ambience, which is enhanced by a monochromatic palette and softened by natural tones and textures. Dark oak floors provide an elegant contrast to the ivory coloured walls and semi-transparent bronze mesh screens. Classic four-poster bed frames are reimagined in bold contemporary angles and inset with upholstered bedhead panels of ivory flowered silk and velvet entwined with gold thread, conjuring understated Chinoiserie whimsy.

Glossy black lacquer cupboards are inspired by imperial Chinese furnishings, and are offset by restrained merlot colour on bench seating and soft Bvlgari cashmere blankets. All tabletops are finished with Tuscan Calacatta marble, favoured by Michelangelo for its unique threads of grey and gold on pure white stone. Latest technology is seamlessly incorporated, including large TVs that disappear with the touch of a button into custom-designed cabinets so as not to interrupt the panoramic views through an entire wall of windows.

The furniture and lighting in every room was custom-designed or selected by ACPV ARCHITECTS Antonio Citterio Patricia Viel, and CONTEMPORARY ITALIAN STYLE 7 tailor-made by revered Italian brands, including B&B, Maxalto, Flos and Flexform. Bathrooms are embellished with light Navona travertine imported from near Rome and top-quality Axor fittings, and feature a wet box with full-size bathtub and rainshower for a pampered bathing experience.



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For an unforgettable stay, the exceptional 400sqm The Bvlgari Suite is accessed via private lift, and can be extended to create a 570sqm residence by connecting with adjoining rooms. Double height ceilings enhance the lavish sense of space in the living room, where guests can relax and enjoy dramatic views of the Shanghai cityscape. Ideal for special events or private entertaining, the living area features a backlit onyx bar with a connected Bulthaup kitchen leading to a separate dining room and study. The main bathroom exudes splendence with a bathtub and vanity carved from a single slab of rare green onyx from Pakistan, complemented by private steam and massage rooms.

Crowning the uppermost floor, The Bvlgari Bar and Il Ristorante – Niko Romito shimmer seductively against the panoramic backdrop of the riverfront Bund and Pudong skyline. The iconic hammered-copper oval counter of The Bvlgari Bar topped with mirrored steel, warmly reflects the natural teak floors and ceilings. Guests can repose in style courtesy of sleek chrome and black leather furnishings.

The alluring design theme flows directly into Il Ristorante – Niko Romito, where the chairs and the columns are wrapped in dark brown leather to contrast the lighter tones of the teak floor and walls, hung with artworks of Dolce Vita sirens. Generously spaced tables are arranged on different levels for added theatrical effect and to ensure that all diners can share the stunning city vistas.

MAKING HOTELS LIKE JEWELS: PRECIOUS MATERIALS AND CRAFTSMANSHIP

Since 1884, Bvlgari has been synonymous with contemporary Italian style, rooted in the classical Roman world. From its fine jewelries, watches and accessories to luxury hotels, Bvlgari continues to inspire with its unique vision and contemporary Italian design, crafted with an uncompromising attention to quality.

A rich array of hand-selected rare marbles from across Italy and Pakistan recreate the splendor of The Eternal City in Shanghai. The hotel's architects and artisans travelled to quarries far and wide to choose the singular marble slabs, and ensure that each piece was cut and polished to the highest standard of beauty.

This process – comparable to Bvlgari's jewelry creation whereby a rough stone's potential is identified, crafted, cut and polished with care, before being transformed into a fine jewel – exemplifies the exquisite attention to detail that hallmarks each Bvlgari hotel & resort.



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Superb marble detailing throughout the hotel includes Green Onyx from Pakistan in the bathroom of The Bvlgari Suite. Swirling with deep emerald and gold veins of singularity, the precious stone was 'book matched' cut from a single slab of marble and polished on opposite sides, enabling a near mirror image of its veins and peculiarities. Sculpted to perfection, the Green Onyx helps to banish negative emotions and welcome good fortune, heightening the sense of wellbeing and indulgence for privileged guests.

Even the public bathrooms showcase Breccia di Seravezza, a coveted Roman marble with rich red and purple veins that was used to ornament Saint Peter's Basilica in the Vatican City. A pale Navona travertine lends warm matte ivory hues and Roman grandeur to the guestrooms and public spaces. Adding extra allure to the luxuriously styled The Bvlgari Spa is Grey Vicenza stone from Verona. Featuring prehistoric fossils from the seabed, this soft marble is both honed and raw sandblasted to craft intriguing textures and contrasts along the Spa hallways.

Glassmaking is another cherished Italian tradition of craftsmanship incorporated into the hotel's breathtaking interiors. Suspended above Il Ristorante – Niko Romito is a custom-designed Murano light installation accented with gold leaf that was hand-blown by master craftsmen at the Venetian glassmaker, Barovier & Toso.

BVLGARI ICONS AND ETERNITY OF ROME

While the Bvlgari Hotels & Resorts collection has evolved to include new locations, a Bvlgari property is always born of the quintessential Roman spirit. This is reflected in iconic characteristics that identify and strengthen the brand across its portfolio; powerful in their design distinction, they are precisely what a Bvlgari guest expects.

Bvlgari's auspicious eight-pointed star motif was inspired by the star on the floor of Rome's Campidoglio (City Hall) designed by Michelangelo and first appeared in 1933 as an inlay in the vestibule of Bvlgari's flagship Via dei Condotti boutique. Emblematic of the Bvlgari brand, the eight-pointed star outlined in gold welcomes guests in the driveway and in the marble entrance of Bvlgari Hotel Shanghai.



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The oval Bar is a priceless icon of the Bvlgari hospitality collection. The famed Fontana della Barcaccia at the bottom of the Spanish Steps and close to Bvlgari's Roman boutique, is said to have inspired its shape, symbolic of a boat sailing to new destinations. For Shanghai, the bar was made from hand-hammered bronze, recalling the expert craftsmanship of the Roman jeweler and its water like texture references Suzhou Creek visible through the windows.

The lobby fireplace has also become a signature, offering a warm welcome in all Bvlgari lobbies. In Shanghai, the central fireplace and its glowing chimney features the equally iconic 'Maglia Pantheon' pattern. The geometrical configuration is inspired by ornamentation found on the floor of the Pantheon – part of the architectural tradition of Baroque Rome and a timeless source of inspiration for Bvlgari designs.

The Bvlgari Spa has quickly become an icon of the hospitality collection, featuring Roman inspirations and shimmering mosaic tiles. The centerpiece is a 25-metre indoor swimming pool, surrounded by curtained cabanas and statuesque columns recalling the grandeur of a Roman bath. Long strips of louvered teak line the ceiling while a 'skylight wall' incorporates natural sunshine feeding the luxuriant tropical interior garden. Thoughtful details, such as overhead lights distinguishing where the pool ends for guests swimming backstroke, demonstrate the intricate care that hallmarks Bvlgari Hotels & Resorts' design.

Inset within a cave of travertine stone is the vitality pool back-dropped by a splashing waterfall cascading over gold Bvlgari lettering. Sparkling mosaic throughout the pool and wellness lounges recall the pattern in Rome's ancient Terme Di Caracalla thermal baths. A refreshing ice fountain crafted from Green Onyx is artfully positioned in front of steam room, with a constant flow of sparkling ice tumbling down from the ceiling to resemble diamonds cascading from the sky.

An infusion of green space is integral to Bvlgari's urban properties. For Shanghai, the Italian garden is available for private parties and events, its glass ceiling filtering in natural sunlight, or the beauty of a night sky. With teak wood chairs, sculpted designer fans and an abundance of greenery, the romance of its setting is reminiscent of the Italian garden at the original Bvlgari Hotel in Milan.



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ENVIRONMENTAL CONSCIOUSNESS

Bvlgari Hotel Shanghai is strongly committed to minimizing the environmental impact of its operations, starting from the design of its facilities. The use of double-sided thermal insulated glass windows and a curtain wall system in the construction process efficiently decreases waste from solar heat consumption, while the elaborately planned angles and colors of the mass glass windows reduce light pollution.

Sustainability and noise reduction are also top priorities. In guestrooms, four air-conditioners recycle heat from exhaust emissions and use it to warm the fresh air, thus saving both electricity and natural gas consumption. Meanwhile, a heat recycling cooling water set and cooling system saves up to a third of air-conditioning consumption.

Environment protection cards placed in all guestrooms encourage guests to reuse towels and bedsheets when staying more than one night, and taking home as a small gift used Bvlgari bottled bath amenities. Bvlgari Hotel Shanghai also uses Ecolab green detergents, which maximize washing machine capacity to save energy and further help protect the environment.

ARCHITECTURE AND DESIGN OF THE FORMER CHAMBER OF COMMERCE SHANGHAI

Completed during Shanghai's Pearl of the Orient heyday in 1916, the magnificent former Chamber of Commerce Shanghai has been carefully restored by Italian architectural firm ACPV ARCHITECTS Antonio Citterio Patricia Viel, in collaboration with United Design Group Office for Urban Renewal, to recapture memories of its glorious past and preserve a unique piece of Shanghai's history. Resplendent once more, it now serves as the glamorous Bvlgari Ballroom and haut cuisine Chinese restaurant Bao Li Xuan.

Constructed in Neoclassical Renaissance style, the statuesque landmark forms a serendipitous connection to Bvlgari's Roman roots. Its columned and patterned brick façade is adorned with double stone staircases and large windows topped with decorative pediments. A first of its kind in China, the Chamber served as a gathering place for business executives in a city brimming with commercial ambition. In later decades, the building fell into disrepair – until its stunning reclamation over a century after it was built. The unmistakable kinship enabled the designers to achieve an organic blend of Italian design and Shanghai historical décor.

Within the entrance foyer, an original Chinese floor mosaic was discovered and restored. Coiling with colourful history, the intricate petal design has become a new emblem for Bvlgari Hotel Shanghai. Elaborate original skirting mosaics meander throughout the foyer, interspersed with stylish custom carpets. Up above, a coffered ceiling with intricately sculpted cornices is supported by a procession of vaulted columns that have been meticulously refurbished and embellished by discreet spotlighting.

Once again home to Shanghai is the dazzling fashion shows, high society dinners, private celebrations, weddings, banquets and meetings, the 500sqm The Bvlgari Ballroom is the centerpiece of the heritage icon. Original carved wooden doors open into the magnificent 1916 hall lined with dark oak floors. Impressive 10-metre high ceilings enhance the sense of grandeur, crowned by arched carved paneling and skylights that flood the venue with natural light.



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An original proscenium stage is ideal for musical and theatrical performances and business presentations. Spanning three sides of the Ballroom is an elaborate mezzanine balcony with decorative cast-iron railings, coiling plaster supports and sculpted wooden staircases, all beautifully restored to their original splendor.

Two custom masterpieces have been created for The Former Chamber of Commerce Shanghai by famous Chinese artists Peiming Yan and Xiaodong Liu. Mr. Liu's artwork features the white magnolia – Shanghai's city flower – and is inspired by the patterns of a Song Dynasty fan in colors reminiscent of traditional Shanghainese calendars. Mr. Yan chose to depict two doves of peace soaring high in the sky providing a connecting link between the two superb artworks. The custom paintings were created on circular canvases, echoing the vaulted ceiling of the building's architecture and instilling classical Chinese elements of harmony and balance. The paintings hang in The Bvlgari Ballroom framing the stage on each side and blessing the space timeless culture and bespoke artistic inspiration.

Ascending an imposing balustrade staircase, the building's third level is home to Chinese fine-dining restaurant Bao Li Xuan and The Whisky Bar. Beneath coffered ceilings, the elegant design pays homage to Shanghai culture with walls of turquoise raw silk wallpaper, black lacquer panels and art deco patterned carpets. Contemporary flair blends with a sleek Chinese aesthetic in the custom-made Italian chairs by Maxalto and artistic lighting by Flos. Even the restaurant bathrooms reimagine Roman tradition, as beautiful Breccia di Seravezza marble sinks are etched with vein patterns that are both singular and timeless.

The name Bao Li Xuan means "nature's treasure and magnificence". A jewel of the former Chamber of Commerce Shanghai, Bao Li Xuan blends the essential Italian glamour of Bvlgari with distinctive Chinese culture. Echoing Bvlgari's unique vision and uncompromising attention to quality. Bao Li Xuan's master chefs select the seasonal ingredients, crafted into exquisite Cantonese classics specialties. Bao Li Xuan is the Bvlgari Hotels and Resorts Group's first Chinese restaurant globally. It features both heritage and cosmopolitan style, innovation as well as tradition. With chef Fu's culinary excellence, Bao Li Xuan was awarded one Michelin star in 2020 and two Michelin stars from 2021.



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Six private dining rooms, available for exclusive banquets or dinner parties, are identified with their own color of silk wallpaper – a tradition native to China – in hues inspired by Bvlgari gemstones. Hanging from the walls in wooden frames are actual hand-drawn jewelry sketches from the Bvlgari archives, recalling the brand's 20th-Century origins.

A discreet wine cellar on the ground floor is encased in brushed larch and exposed brick with low ceilings, creating an atmospheric venue for private dinners and wine tastings. Direct lift access is offered from the wine cellar to the second- floor restaurant.

For a relaxing after-dinner cocktail, The Whisky Bar is paneled in dark oak with a glowing ivory onyx bar matched by backlit onyx cabinets storing an extensive collection of premium whiskies and spirits. Contemporary Maxalto tan leather armchairs and freestanding Flos lamps create a sophisticated ambience akin to a member's club.

A century after the former Chamber of Commerce Shanghai was a gathering place for the city's important business magnates, it once again hosts local and visiting elites as a destination par excellence epitomising the fine Bvlgari lifestyle.

Contemporary and glamorous, Bvlgari Hotel Shanghai's 63 rooms and 19 suites reimagine luxury urban living in China's cosmopolitan city. Crowning the top floors of a 48-storey riverside tower, guests are welcomed into a serene personal sanctuary where elevated indulgence is paired with sleek design by Italian architectural firm ACPV ARCHITECTS Antonio Citterio Patricia Viel.

As space is a cherished luxury for modern travelers, the rooms at Bvlgari Hotel Shanghai are the spacious in the city. Rooms range from over 50sqm to 65sqm, while exquisite suites extend from 81sqm to the 393sqm Bvlgari Suite, and showcase spectacular views of the famous Bund waterfront and futuristic Pudong skyline through panoramic floorto-ceiling windows.

The furniture and lighting in every room was custom-designed or selected by ACPV ARCHITECTS Antonio Citterio Patricia Viel, and hand-crafted by revered Italian brands, including B&B, Maxalto, Flos and Flexform.

At the heart of Bvlgari's approach to guest comfort, Bvlgari Hotel Shanghai incorporates the Bvlgari innovation of a private alcove to enter the room. This welcoming detail enables guests to enjoy a sense of arriving 'home' before even opening the door. Hallway alcoves are embellished with louvered walnut wood and bronze mesh screens adding style and sophistication.

Glossy black lacquer cupboards recall timeless Chinese aesthetics, complemented by the bold sheen of Bvlgari jewels in the merlot color accents on bench seating and soft Bvlgari cashmere rugs.

A creative partnership between Bvlgari and ACPV ARCHITECTS Antonio Citterio Patricia Viel resulted in a unique 'stacked trunk' design for the placards and folding screens. This eye-catching feature evokes adventurous journeys in China from a previous era when discerning travelers commissioned four trunks containing clothing for each season. Recapturing this decadent tradition, the screens open to reveal a spacious yet modern walk-in closet inspired by the location.



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The vanity niche is a quintessential Bvlgari detail, fashioning a custom-crafted leather stool with the handles and logo markings of a Bvlgari handbag. The large make-up mirror is lined with theatrical light bulbs drawing on the spirit of famed Dolce Vita celebrities.

State-of-the-art technology enhances guest comfort and convenience throughout their stay. Only in suites, the TV can be made to disappear into a bespoke cabinet with the touch of a button to avoid interrupting the panoramic views through an entire wall of windows.

Peerless attention to details extends to a resplendence of thoughtful in-room amenities. Guests can savor premium Chinese teas from their bespoke tea set created by Roman artist Susanna Valerio, while hand-painted ceramics are crafted by Italian-Balinese brand Gaya. A yoga mat is provided in each guestroom while all suites feature Sennheiser headphones providing optimal audio quality and Technogym weights for a reinvigorating workout in private.

For an unforgettable event space or private indulgence, the exceptional 393sqm Bvlgari Suite offers sweeping views of the Bund and Huangpu River extending across the city to the Pudong skyline. Bulgari Hotel Shanghai is home to six signature gourmet dining options: one Michelin-starred restaurant Il Ristorante – Niko Romito, The Bulgari Bar, La Terrazza and The Lounge in the hotel tower, along with two Michelin-starred Bao Li Xuan Chinese fine-dining restaurant and the Whisky Bar in the former Chamber of Commerce Shanghai. In addition, Shanghai guests and residents are able to experience the first and only Bulgari chocolate boutique in China at Bulgari Dolci, as well as indulge at Il Giardino, an enchanting alfresco space inspired by the romantic Italian garden at the original Bulgari Hotel in Milan.

FORMER CHAMBER OF COMMERCE SHANGHAI BAO LI XUAN, CHINESE FINE-DINING RESTAURANT

Located on the third floor of the former Chamber of Commerce Shanghai that is integrated into Bulgari Hotel Shanghai, two Michelin-starred Chinese fine-dining restaurant Bao Li Xuan serves Cantonese haute cuisine. Chinese Chef Fu will offer menu based on tradition and quality.

Beneath restored coffered ceilings, the elegant design pays homage to Shanghai culture with walls of turquoise raw silk wallpaper, black lacquer panels and art deco patterned carpets. Contemporary flair blends with a sleek Chinese aesthetic in the custom-made Italian chairs by Maxalto and artistic lighting by Flos. Six private dining rooms, available for exclusive banquets or dinner parties, are identified with their own color of silk wallpaper – a tradition native to China – in hues inspired by Bulgari gemstones and adorned with hand-drawn jewelry sketches from the Bulgari archives.

Fine wines from the large walk-through wine cellar on the ground floor, plus a variety of Chinese baijiu, yellow wine and fresh teas, are specially selected by the resident sommelier to complement the refined cuisine.

An exciting partnership between Bvlgari Hotels & Resorts and Niko Romito – one of the world's celebrated chefs with 3 Michelin stars for his Reale restaurant in Abruzzo – brings Niko Romito's carefully curated canon of contemporary Italian cooking to Shanghai for the first time. Working from his headquarters in Italy in close consultation with his personally trained Italian resident chef, Niko Romito presents a menu that expresses the culture, elegance and vitality of 'Made in Italy'.

The 'Bvlgari menu' created by Chef Niko Romito is an anthology of great classics of Italian tradition – not just in terms of ingredients and recipes, but concepts tied to presentation and service – interpreted in an updated way. With a focus on purity and simplicity, he combines premium Italian and locally sourced ingredients with humble ingredients ennobled by technique. An original antipasto that encapsulates a grand tour of all the regions of Italy, recodified versions of Tagliatelle with Ragù, Veal Milanese, Broken Pasta with Octopus and Potato, and Tiramisù are just a few of the quintessential dishes on the Il Ristorante table. Careful attention is also given to "those little touches like the grating of parmigiano (a timeless Italian ritual), the drizzling of raw olive oil over a minestrone, or the dripping of balsamic vinegar".



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The highly original wine list focuses on authentic wines that celebrate a natural expression of the terroir and wine making process with the least human intervention. The sommelier highlights an exciting selection of organic and biodynamic wines from Piemonte, Toscana and Champagne, along with lesser known regions and grape varieties that will delight connoisseurs, including fine wines from Xinjiang, China. A limited edition of 250 numbered and autographed bottles of Podernuovo a Palazzone Di Giovanni Bulgari, created exclusively for Bvlgari Hotels and Resorts, is also on offer. Diners can choose from three different menu options: 'à la carte', 'set menu' and 'sharing menu', and the latter two are also available with a curated wine pairing selection.

Open for lunch and dinner, Il Ristorante – Niko Romito's glamorous ambience recalls the romance of Rome. Chairs and columns are wrapped in dark-brown leather to sensually contrast the lighter tones of the teak floor and walls, hung with pictures from the Dolce Vita era when celebrities first discovered the elegance of Bvlgari design. Accentuating the triple-height ceilings, Murano light fixtures, custom designed by one of the oldest Italian glass manufacturers, Barovier & Toso, float like lantern-bubbles from above. Generously spaced tables are arranged on different levels for added theatrical effect and to ensure that all diners can share the stunning city vistas.

Sharing the 47th floor with Il Ristorante – Niko Romito, The Bvlgari Bar shimmers seductively against the panoramic backdrop of the riverfront Bund and Pudong skyline. The Bvlgari Bar's centrepiece oval counter, inspired by Rome's famed Fontana della Barcaccia, has become an icon of the Bvlgari hospitality collection and is interpreted in each property with different materials.

For Shanghai, the bar was made from hand-hammered bronze topped with mirrored steel, recalling the expert craftsmanship of the Roman jeweler. Its water-like texture references Suzhou Creek visible through the windows. Guests can repose in style courtesy of sleek chrome and black leather furnishings. An even more dramatic panorama awaits on the private outdoor terrace, celebrating sumptuous Shanghai views in the open air.



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The Bvlgari Bar's menu mixes classic Italian cocktails and an eclectic selection of wines, along with fine teas and snacks. The Bvlgari Aperitivo, made famous by the Milan property, is a drink that takes place at the end of the workday as a kind of warm-up to dinner in Italy. The Bvlgari Bar invites guests to enjoy one of the quintessential cultural expressions of Italy. Relax over a glass of wine or a light cocktail and finger foods to kick-start a gorgeous evening - not to mention, the perfect way to enjoy the sunset over Shanghai.

LA TERRAZZA

Crowning the rooftop of the hotel, La Terrazza presents a dazzling panorama of Shanghai's unforgettable skyline. The Italian resort-style oasis is designed with teak decking, ivory cushioned armchairs and romantic curtained cabanas. Candle-lit lanterns and exotic flora add an enchanting ambience to the unobstructed 180-degree views over Shanghai at this prestigious elevated venue.

Signature sipping includes the Bvlgari cocktail, a refreshing concoction of gin, Aperol, fresh orange juice, pineapple and lime juice.

THE LOUNGE

The Lounge is a welcoming retreat to enjoy wines, or simply to relax by the fireplace and relish the sophisticated ambience.

Sleek and stylish Italian décor with low-slung leather lounges, dark marble and bronze mesh screens is augmented in winter by a cozy fireplace and dramatic custom-made light fixture in Bvlgari's signature Maglia Pantheon pattern. Glamorous photos of Italian celebrities from the 1960s and luxuriant private garden views complement the chic lounge.

IL GIARDINO

With a private cabana located at the end of the garden, Mediterranean-styled Il Giardino is a perfect spot to indulge in selected wines. The Italian garden is also available for private parties and events. With an abundance of lush greenery, the romantic setting is reminiscent of the Italian garden at the original Bvlgari Hotel in Milan.



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BVLGARI DOLCI

Bvlgari Dolci at Bvlgari Hotel Shanghai is the only Bvlgari chocolate boutique in China, offering fine chocolate gems handcrafted by the Maitre Chocolatier at the Bvlgari Boutique next door. To intensify the chocolate experience, Bvlgari artisans use raw cocoa, which features nearly four times the antioxidants of regular dark chocolate and imparts delicious natural coffee notes.

Nestled on the ground floor leading out to the Italian gardens, Bvlgari Dolci's striped mosaic walls are inspired by the first Bvlgari print advertisement from the 1920s and contrast hues of rich chocolate with creamy vanilla. The 'chocolate gem' creations of the Roman jeweler are displayed in glass jewel cases like their gemstone counterparts.



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SPA AND FITNESS

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In the heart of one of the world's dynamic cities resides a haven of tranquil wellbeing: The Bvlgari Spa. Enjoying a serene riverside location amid private parks and gardens, Bvlgari Hotel Shanghai's 2,000-square-metre SPA and fitness center is a harmonious retreat to balance the body, mind and spirit in elegant Italian style.

Spanning an entire subterranean floor, the SPA has been created by ACPV ARCHITECTS Antonio Citterio Patricia Viel as a cave-like oasis embedded with grey Vicenza stone from Verona. This soft marble is rich in prehistoric fossils from the seabed. It is used in both honed and raw sandblasted form to craft intriguing textures and contrasts along the SPA hallways. The effect is a soothing sense of communing with nature.

In addition to 8 SPA treatment rooms, SPA guests can enjoy steam, sauna and relaxation rooms, a manicure and pedicure salon, barber and hairdresser, plus a wellness retail area and refreshment lounge. Fitness amenities feature a 25-metre heated indoor pool and vitality pools, 24-hour Technogym Fitness Studio, plus a dedicated yoga and Pilates studio.

THE BVLGARI SPA

A highlight of The Bvlgari experience, The Bvlgari Spa offers market-leading advanced beauty treatments using La Mer products, alongside authentic treatments inspired by Chinese wellbeing rituals.

Renowned for its luxury treatments, signature journeys include the 90-minute Bvlgari Signature Face Care, a luxurious treatment utilizing the power of gemstones and bespoke techniques created by La Mer to transform the face and décolletage leaving the skin softened, strengthened and renewed.

The Bvlgari Spa features 8 SPA treatment rooms, including two Couple's SPA Suite replete with a Roman-inspired marble hot tub and a 68sqm Deluxe Couple's Suite where guests can enjoy the luxury of a private sauna.



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SWIMMING POOL AND VITALITY POOL

The centerpiece of The Bvlgari Spa is a 25-metre indoor heated swimming pool, surrounded by statuesque columns recalling the grandeur of a Roman bath. Long strips of louvered teak line the ceiling while a 'skylight wall' incorporates natural sunshine feeding the luxuriant tropical interior garden. Thoughtful details, such as overhead lights distinguishing where the pool ends for guests swimming backstroke, demonstrate the intricate care that hallmarks Bvlgari Hotels & Resorts design.

Beside the swimming pool, inset within a cave of travertine stone, a large vitality pool is back-dropped by a splashing waterfall cascading over gold Bvlgari lettering. Sparkling mosaic throughout the pool and wellness lounges recall the pattern in Rome's ancient Terme Di Caracalla thermal baths. A refreshing ice fountain crafted from green onyx is artfully positioned in front, with a constant flow of sparkling ice tumbling down from the ceiling to resemble diamonds cascading from the sky.

FITNESS CENTER

The Bvlgari Gymnasium is well equipped with state-of-the-art Technogym equipment. Originally completed during Shanghai's Pearl of the Orient heyday in 1916, the statuesque Neoclassical Renaissance landmark was a gathering place for the city's important business magnates and social elite. Brought to its ancient grandeur over a century later to epitomise the refined Bvlgari lifestyle, this prestigious destination hosts Shanghai's glamorous fashion shows, society dinners, private celebrations and business meetings.

The centerpiece of the heritage icon is the 500sqm The Bvlgari Ballroom, comfortably accommodating up to 500 guests for cocktails and 300 diners for a banquet. Guests enter the grand 127sqm foyer decorated with original Chinese floor mosaics and coffered ceilings supported by a procession of vaulted columns. A contemporary cocktail bar at one end of the foyer is ideal for pre-function socialising and break-out refreshments.

The magnificent hall, crowned by a 10-metre-high arched ceiling with skylights that flood the space with natural light. The original proscenium stage is custom-designed for musical performances and business presentations. Spanning three sides of the Ballroom is an elaborate mezzanine balcony with decorative cast-iron railings, coiling plaster supports and sculpted wooden staircases, all beautifully restored to their original splendor.

Ascending a carved balustrade staircase, the second level of the heritage building is home to Chinese fine-dining restaurant Bao Li Xuan, with 6 private dining rooms serving Cantonese fine dining. A sophisticated Whisky Bar, accessed alongside the restaurant or via The Bvlgari Ballroom mezzanine level, provides post-event relaxation and plenty of creative scope for event planners.



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Each unique venue is equipped with multi-functional facilities and the latest audio-visual technology, including teleconferencing facilities. Il Giardino's garden pavilion and La Terrazza's rooftop terrace may also be reserved for private parties.
